



New York State Blues Festival board president Leslie Garcea has been an active participant in the music scene in Syracuse for many years, actively promoting and supporting live, local music. Leslie holds a BA from Muskingum College in Ohio and a Masters in Reading Education from State University of NY in Cortland. Transitioning from teaching students in the elementary classroom, Leslie retired from the Syracuse City School District as a Literacy Instructional Coach, in-servicing classroom teachers on effective teaching strategies to help their students become proficient in both reading and writing. Retirement in 2013 has allowed Leslie more time to pursue her passion of supporting live music.

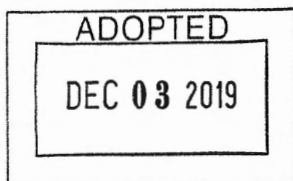

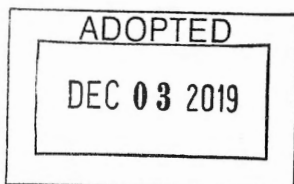

An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer of such County. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. In the event that the 2019 General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are available at the end of the 2019 fiscal year, and if the Chief Fiscal Officer of Onondaga County deems it fiscally advantageous to use surplus funds rather than borrowing, all or a portion of the cost of the improvements

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
