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ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMITTEE - FEBRUARY 9, 2021 VIRTUAL MEETING JUDITH TASSONE, CHAIRMAN

1. WATER ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION: Frank M. Mento, P.E., Commissioner

a. Authorizing the Execution of an Order on Consent with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Relative to the Settlement of the Amended Consent Judgment (Sponsored by Mrs. Tassone)

Mr. Mento:

- Brief history Onondaga County entered into this Federal Consent in January 1988 as a result of a lawsuit brought
 by the DEC and Atlantic States Lake Foundation ("ASLF") for violations to the Clean Water Act WEP has done
 a significant amount of green and grey infrastructure projects intended to reduce impacts of combined sewer
 overflows to the lake
- WEP has achieved all milestones construction and storm water limitations State ordered on consent will now address reoccurring issues with tributaries where we still have some challenges
- Resolution before you authorizes the consent of this order
- Some major issues first plan 5 year order intent is to bridge gap as to where we are now with the Amended Consent Judgment ("ACJ") with where we want to be regulated at end of pipe by a permit that is our goal permit emission this consent order allows this pathway
- Allows for County, ASLF and DEC to petition Federal court to close the ACJ consent order will be effective
 once this is closed
- Component #1 is limited project investment partnership projects like I81 WEP will take advantage and make sanitary improvements; green improvement fund will continue; ASLF agreement who will be doing projects
- DEC & ASLF are now partners with WEP
- Use analysis on three tributaries suggests a reduction or revision to water quality standards
- Limited long tern control plan provides County with a defined end game after 5 years
- Will have less overall cost if we stay in the ACJ the costs continue to escalate this will protect us from other citizen groups to file a lawsuit
- At the end of 5 years we will have an approved Long-term Control plan completely out of ACJ
- Summary product of negotiation for past 6-9 months with DEC allowed for partnership with DEC And ASLF
- This will bring Federal oversight to an end

Dr. Chase:

- Could something be inserted so that it doesn't end in five years hopefully with all our focus this would never happen again but want to be assured it doesn't happen again we have done so much work and focus on green stuff this will not happen again
- How are we doing with Ley creek

Mr. Mento:

- Mechanism is already in place to do the oversight the SPDES (State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System)
 permit this permit requires WEP to meet all kinds of criteria at the end of the pipe applies to all treatment plants and tributaries tributaries will be analyzed extensively
- Ley Creek is one of the tributaries that will be monitored and has some issues some are upstream the tributaries will be the focus of this consent order
- There will be an approval process with DEC and EFA after the five years
- Answered Ms. Tassone's question regarding the number of tributaries that go into the Lake Harbor Brook, Ley Creek and Onondaga Creek –three main tributaries that feed into this analysis
- Some is County responsibility some is upstream that impacts tributaries farms and mud boils for instance DEC understands this broken responsibility

Mr. Yaus:

• Three tributary outfalls are under the Metro permit

A motion was made by Mr. Holmquist, seconded by Dr. Chase to approve this item. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED
